Emergency Motion: Reject the NUS National Ballot

The Union Notes:

- There is a Teaching Excellence Framework (TEF) being introduced by the Conservative Government which allows universities to raise their fees based on a series of metrics including the NSS.
- Goldsmiths Students' Union unanimously voted to Boycott the NSS as one tactic to oppose the TEF.
- The NSS Boycott was part of policy passed at the National Union of Students National Conference in April 2016.
- This policy was put forward by delegates from Goldsmiths SU and Kings College London SU.
- A thorough consultation process was carried out by the NUS to individual SUs to understand what action officers would like to take.
 91% came out in favour of NSS action.
- For the first time ever a National Ballot has been called to ask 'should NUS conduct and publish a risk assessment and equality impact assessment before finalising the NSS boycott/sabotage?'

The Union Believes:

- Democratic mandate passed at National Conference should be respected and acted upon.
- The National Ballot is a political tactic being used to undermine the policy passed at National Conference and the work of the VP Higher Education since then.
- That the NSS Boycott is the most effective method of highlighting the flaws present in the TEF, as well as the most practical method of opposition.

That Goldsmiths SU votes NO to the National Ballot
